

PAPER BIN - THURSDAY PICK UP

WHAT



Office Paper & Junk mail

Brown paper bags

Corrugated cardboard

Cereal & pasta boxes

HOW

Remove plastic linings, windows, and excessive tape. Flatten & place boxes inside each other; items may be bundled in paper bags or boxes or tied with twine. All paper must be dry.

DO NOT INCLUDE

- waxed cardboard such as milk or OJ cartons
- plastic or styrofoam packing materials
- cardboard with any trace of food
- hardcover books

NO PLASTIC BAGS IN EITHER BIN

Recycling bins at DPW yard (69 Southside Avenue) follow same rules as above. Bins open 7 days a week, dawn to dusk.

SPECIAL HANDLING

BULK PICKUP: furniture, mattresses, scrap metal, wire, pipes, motors, sheet metal, appliances, auto parts are picked up by appointment. **478-2171**

YARD WASTE: We encourage mulching in place / on your property with the Love'Em & Leave'Em program.

COMMINGLED BIN - FRIDAY PICK UP

WHAT



METAL

Food & beverage cans

Clean aluminum foil & aluminum trays

Empty aerosol cans

GLASS

Glass jars/bottles of any size & color

PLASTIC coded:



Food containers

Beverage containers

Detergent bottles

Household cleaner & shampoo bottles

Coded pails/buckets • Coded flower pots/trays

HOW

Rinse all containers clean. Remove all caps & place caps loose in bin. Labels do not need to be removed.

DO NOT INCLUDE

- toys, plastic bags, plastic film or styrofoam, regardless of recycling code
- light bulbs, drinking glasses, crystal, window or mirror glass, ceramicware
- kitchen cookware, aluminum siding, scrap metal, appliances, autoparts, pipes, wire hangers, paint cans or any containers that held potentially hazardous materials, such as pesticides, glues, or hazardous solvents

LET'S MAKE LESS TRASH!

Use Up, Wear Out, Make Do or Do Without.

PreCycle: (before you recycle): Refuse excess packaging • Buy reusable packaging • Use your own containers and buy bulk • Use more durable, fewer disposable items (bags, beverage containers, napkins, etc.) • Choose aluminum over glass or plastic for single use packaging & recycle the aluminum • Compost food scraps — up to 1/3 of our garbage is made up of compostable food.

Close the loop: Buy items made from recycled content (paper towels, toilet paper, copy/printer paper, etc.)

Recycle: Properly sort & put out your recyclables - The other side of this page is a guide on what and how to recycle at the curb.

Remember:

ALL BINS and BUNDLES PUT TO THE CURB MUST NOT EXCEED 40 POUNDS.

DO NOT INCLUDE PLASTIC BAGS IN ANY RECYCLING BIN.

WHAT IS HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Most automotive fluids: antifreeze, brake fluid, gasoline • Metal, jewelry, and furniture polish • Pesticides, insecticides, herbicides • Photo and swimming pool chemicals • Kerosene and other flammable liquids • Wood preservatives and stains • Car tires (up to four per household) • Propane and helium tanks • Mercury thermometers, thermostats • Electronic waste (e.g., computers and peripherals [keyboard, harddrives, etc], TV's, cell phones, etc.) • Fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs and tube-shaped fluorescent bulbs) • Freon-containing appliances (e.g., air conditioners, refrigerators, and dehumidifiers) • Batteries: auto, rechargeable and button cell (Alkaline and carbon-zinc batteries can be safely discarded with the household trash.) • Expired or unused pharmaceuticals (first Tuesday of each month only; prescription or over-the-counter medications must be in their original bottle or container) • Fire extinguishers

HAZARDOUS WASTE CANNOT BE PUT OUT FOR CURBSIDE PICKUP.
