Landscaping, including street trees	Y	Landscaping, including street trees was a significant consideration in the Hillside Ave sidewalk project, the Uniontown playground parking lot development, and the repaving and upgrades to Warburton Ave (2019). Farragut Parkway was planted with a "golden mile" of daffodils by a volunteer. Parts of Mt. Hope were cleared of invasives and debris and returned to usable park land. Pollinator flowers have been planted along this median. (2021)
Street trees	Y	In various parts of the Village street trees have been planted in median islands, along streets and in sidewalks. Many trees are planted in the sidewalk, in the downtown.
