Multi-use path physically separated from motor vehicle traffic	Y	In 2022, the Chauncy Lane/Reynolds Field Playground pedestrian walkway project was implemented to create a safe route to "Five Corners". In 2022, a new pedestrian path was added at Wagner Plaza as part of the Revolutionary Hastings improvements to the park (which included the installation of historical signage, plantings, and new street furniture). In 2022, a new pedestrian pathway was added at "Five Corners" (Main & Warburton) as part of the improvements to the area (which included plantings and new street furniture).

In 2021, as part of the Ravensdale Bridge replacement project, a multi-use path was created to link pedestrians and cyclists to the South County Trail.



The Old Croton Aqueduct runs through the Village and functions as a pedestrian and cyclist multi-use path; it is physically separated from motor vehicle traffic and the crosswalks are repainted every year.

Safe and accessible public transportation stops	Y	In 2021, as part of the Ravensdale Bridge replacement project, a covered bus stop was built with bike racks near the entrance to the Village and the South County Trail.

Landscaping, including street trees	Y	In 2022, landscaping, including replacing street trees, was a key consideration in the Downtown sidewalk project. In addition, in recent years volunteers have upgraded landscaping near "Five Corners" to create a butterfly garden and residents have participated in the "Adopt-a-Spot" program and have pledged to care for specific open space plots in the Village such as medians.
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Narrower traffic lanes	Y	In 2022, as part of the Farragut Ave repaving project, after the street was resurfaced it was repainted with narrower traffic lanes and bike lanes were added in various places (see HERE).
On-street car parking	Y	After 2022 resurfacing, Farragut Ave was repainted to include more on-street parking on both sides of the road.
Speed bumps	N	No additional bumps currently planned.
Reduced speed limit	Y	In 2018, the Village adopted a law reducing the speed limit in the School Zone to 15 MPH; the signs were installed in 2019.
